

## Information Sheet 4: Donations

Whilst our collections continue to keep pace with recent, even current, events through the provision of Official photographs we are also very dependent upon voluntary donations from serving personnel, who can provide imagery of what might be considered 'ordinary' subjects that cannot be taken by service photographers. An example is relaxation and living conditions in barracks and camps whether in UK, on exercise or on operations. Another example would include the less glamorous or more mundane duties such as maintenance of kit and equipment. Such donations are always gratefully received.

We are also always pleased to receive older photographs, paintings, sketches etc and would ask that it is never assumed that 'nobody will want that now', at least give the Museum the opportunity to assess what you have. We seek to expand our knowledge of the history of the Corps through any sort of imagery. We do not seek images because of their artistic quality or their financial value. Please offer before you dispose of anything that you might have, or have been given or have inherited.
